Volunteer efforts being hugely successful, freed up project funds to focus on other parts of the home improvement needs. Project costs were then redirected to build a well-needed covering over Wilson's entry way to protect the family from future inclement weather which would have otherwise caused damage to the house. In addition, Home Modification Loan Program (HMLP) funds were used to create accessibility with a modified bathroom and kitchen which allowed the owner to be safely housed and to ultimately age in place. If HIP did not facilitate and fund this project, the family would have been displaced and unable to afford to remain in Cambridge. This project perfectly fits HIP's mission to renovate, restore and allow low-income families to remain in their homes. We hope you enjoyed Wilson's renovation journey. Our HIP Advisory Member Spotlight: John Hixson



John Hixson came to Cambridge at age 18 in 1969 and never left. An internship with the City launched a 43-year career in community development, starting with the Harvard to Alewife subway extension and other transportation planning. In 1981, he started housing work in Somerville, followed by Salem, Newton, Reading, and South Shore Housing, retiring in 2016. He and his wife own their home in North Cambridge while their grown children are in St. Paul and Los Angeles. Housing is the most basic requirement for a healthy life, and John has

always been interested in helping make affordable housing happen, including serving on the HRI Board and in particular, the Home Improvement Advisory Committee.

Key Housing Resources and Announcement

Utility Relief

As of July 1st, the utility moratorium put in place during the COVID-19 pandemic will end and Eversource will shut off gas and electric service to residents who have an overdue balance on their accounts.

Take action to protect yourself from disconnection!

- 1. Enroll in the reduced electricity or reduced gas rate. You may qualify for up to a 36% discount for electricity and 25% for gas on your monthly utility bills. Find your rates on the backside of your Eversource electricity and gas bills at the top of the "Delivery" sections.
- **2.** Sign up for Eversource's New Start program. This program **forgives overdue** balances as on-time payments are made, helping you pay off your bills faster.

Home Modification Loan Program

- What is Home Modification Program? A statewide program funded by the Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission to help elders and people with disabilities increase the accessibility of their residences through no-interest loans.
- What do they offer? The program offers loans from \$1,000 to \$50,000 to individuals and families for modifications related to a disability.
- Who is eligible? Any homeowner who has a disability has a household member who has a disability, or rents to an individual with a disability may apply for a loan. Income guidelines are based on the total household gross income of the homeowner.
